From The Rector

One of the best books I read this summer was a short read by Jane Goodall, entitled, Harvest for Hope. When Goodall's trained eye turned towards our diet and the food industry further she clarified for me the vision we have of reconciliation.

She asks a deep humanitarian question—how are the animals in our industrial food chain being treated? It is a question of relationship and of life. What is the longer impact of unsustainable farming methods, of controls by large industries, of waste of the use of bio-engineering for which we have little long-range understanding?

Giving very specific examples she articulates a remarkable humane and sustainable approach to matters of our diet. Again and again she creates a vision and rationale for organic approaches to farming which we as consumers can support real change for our future.

I hadn't heard this kind of voice articulated so well. It helped me become clearer on what I eat and how I can support change through where and how I purchase food. If I'm spending more on organic food, I realize, I could also eat a little less!

As I was speaking with Paul Kolbet, our associate rector recently, he reminded me that so much of our understand of humanism comes directly from our Christian vision. Dignity to all human life and care for the creation are deeply Christian values.

For me, the resurrection is a vision of completion and wholeness, it is a vision of restored life and how to live peaceably within creation. Jesus' return to his disciples is a word of hope that God is not giving up on us, ever.

This is vision, is one given to "infants and babes" as our Gospel on October 3rd will remind

us. It is a vision of simplicity and sacredness infused throughout all life. It is a vision St. Francis and Clare invited us into. On Oct. 10th we will do a "trash audit" after church and build a compost bin as part of a Global Action Work Party. Come striving always to live reconciled to God and each other.

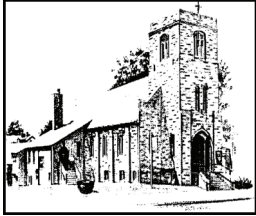

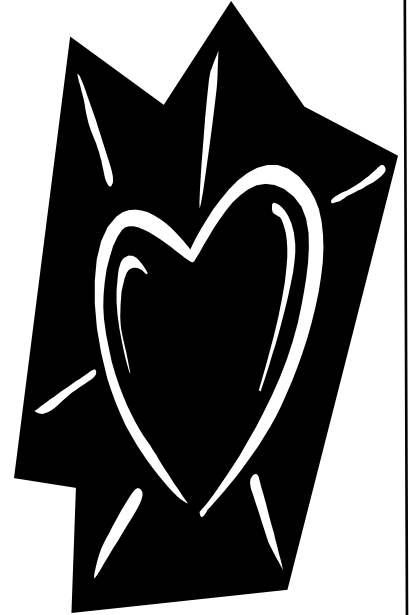

Call for Volunteers for The Miracle Kitchen, Framingham: A Local Outreach

St. Paul's volunteers are needed to provide the meal and servers at the Miracle Kitchen in Framingham on Monday, October 18. The Miracle Kitchen has been serving an evening meal to people for nearly 30 years as the only soup kitchen in Framingham. It is open 6 nights a week and currently serves 80-100 people each night. Volunteer groups provide the main dish, vegetable or salad, and dessert as well as servers. There are many ways to help.

- shop for ingredients on October 16 (St. Paul's reimburses expenses)
- cook a casserole for 20 people (easy recipe and ingredients are provided) on October 17 or 18
- cook rice or pasta for 80 people on October 17 or 18
- chop salad ingredients on October 17 or 18
- bake lots of cookies or another dessert on October 17 or 18
- serve at the Miracle Kitchen on October 18 from 5-7 p.m. (Note: servers must be 18 years or older)

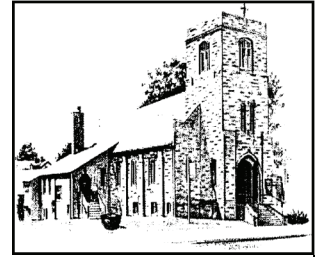

Leaving Home

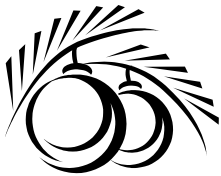

St. Paul's Partners with B-SAFE for a Great Week of Fun, Food and Learning

On August 2 – 6, St. Paul's served as a partner church to B-SAFE (Bishop's Summer Academic and Fun Enrichment), a summer day camp for city youth in Dorchester. The program aims to help break the cycle of violence in the city by providing a safe and healthy summer for the children and the teens who work there. Through exposure to arts, reading, technology, athletics and field trips, the camp aims to broaden horizons as well. This has become a special summer tradition for many members of our parish, and we are pleased to have been able to contribute to this great program again this year. This was our 4th years as a partner!

Children are able to attend the camp for a nominal fee because of the contributions of partner churches such as St. Paul's. As a partner church, St. Paul's provided lunch and snack for one week to seventy campers and counselors at the B-Safe site at St. Mary's Episcopal Church in Dorchester. In addition, St. Paul's planned and sponsored a full-day field trip for the children.

Many members of the St. Paul's community helped to make our week a success. From selling Easter lilies to raise money for the program to menu planning to shopping to baking to preparing lunch to serving lunch to chaperoning the field trip to making financial donations ---- WE COULD NOT HAVE DONE IT WITHOUT YOU! Through each of these phases, we enjoyed fellowship with one another and with the children and counselors at St. Mark's.

We were blessed with great weather once again for our annual field trip to Stage Fort Park in Gloucester for fun on the beach and playground and a pizza lunch together. STEWARDSHIP 2010



Shhh . . . we're having a "quiet" campaign this year. As in other years, we encourage you to thoughtfully and intentionally consider your support of St. Paul's in 2011. October is traditionally the time we think about our ability to support the parish in the upcoming year. While your stewardship committee strives to give you all the information you need, this year we hope to ensure your family has time to reflect and prayerfully discern the pledge that makes the most sense for your family in 2011. The responsibility for the financial health of the parish and the missions we support is to be shared by all of us as we are able to lighten the load.

Please take some time to reflect on what a healthy and sustainable St. Paul's looks like to you, and how you and your family can support this mission.

The stewardship campaign is going green. Only one small mailing – one letter, on one piece of paper, in one small envelope – will be mailed to each parishioner shortly. This is quite different than the large folder of information that had been mailed in large envelopes in recent years. Instead, all information related to stewardship, pledging, and our budget can be found on our web site (www.stpaulsnatick.org). There are also answers to many frequently asked questions on the site, which may be of particular interest to those who are relatively new to St. Paul's. We strive to be as transparent as possible with financial and other related information – if you have any questions about the information on the site, contact Karen Van Voorhis, Rolf Stottmann, or the church office.

Pledge in your pajamas! In place of the more traditional paper pledge forms, the stewardship section of the web site has a pledge form that can be completed and submitted confidentially on-line. Once your pledge is submitted, you will receive a confirmation e-mail. Using our on-line pledging process will eliminate paper waste and will assure that your pledge is recorded properly. *We strongly encourage everyone who can to submit their 2011 pledge on-line during the month of October.* Pledges also can be submitted via e-mail (to Rolf Stottmann, or to the church office at info@stpaulsnatick.org), mailed to the church, or placed in the offering plate.

Our cost savings will go to support outreach. We estimate that posting most of our information on the web site and pledging on-line will easily save several hundred dollars from our stewardship budget by significantly reducing our copying and postage costs. We are excited to announce our intention to contribute these savings to one of St. Paul's worthy outreach efforts.

Our stewardship goals are similar to last year. We continue to celebrate the tremendous growth at St. Paul's in recent years. However, this has necessarily meant increases in operational costs, and we want to avoid drawing on our endowment to cover those costs. Our goals for this year are similar to those in others years. Specifically, we strive for:

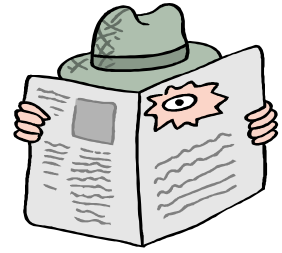
