## **From The Rector**

*We are a welcoming congregation witnessing God's justice, mercy, and reconciling love.*

*We seek a deeper communion with God, with each other and the rest of God's creation.*

*We reach beyond ourselves, both in our shared spiritual journeys and in our service to our neighbors, near and far.*

*We meet God together in our shared worship, prayer, study, service, and fellowship.*

Epiphany is a season of recognition and light, a recognition that there is a Love greater than ourselves in the world into which we are called to serve. This "aha", this epiphany!, eureka!, draws us out of living not for ourselves alone, but for 'him who died and rose for us' (BCP. 374) How do you live not for yourself alone? Not for your family alone? But for an even greater love?

I give thanks for the lovely Christmas services and pageants that revealed our connection to God in the birth of Jesus. There were many moments of grace through all of these for which I am very grateful: The pageant participants brought a sweet spirit to both the 3 and 5pm services and the readers of our poetry in celebration of the Incarnation gave light to these words which say so much, along with the youth and adult choirs' vibrant support.

I give thanks for the conclusion of this year for the giving we have accomplished as a parish—giving over \$40,000 beyond our walls to support Christ's ministry in the world. This was a significant accomplishment by many.

What did not yet happen in 2010 was a visit to our sister parish in Haiti. This trip was postponed because of the closeness of hurricane Tomas. While our communication with our parish has been challenging, we expect to try another reconnection visit this winter/spring. Please keep Holy Innocents, Port-de-Paix in your prayers.

An excellent study for Epiphany is being offered by the diocese in anticipation of a learning event on Saturday, March 5<sup>th</sup>. Some of the particular elements of this involve a subject dear to my heart—considering how the local parish church can become a new kind of monastery, supporting our regular faith practices that form a communal life of meaning: Please go this link to examine these ideas further.

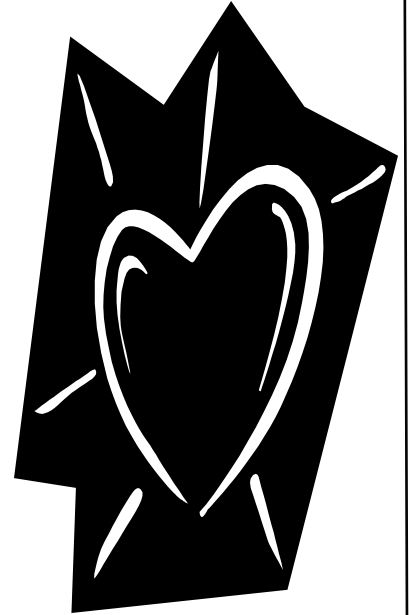

## Hymn of the Month

"I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light" *Houston*

The hymn *Houston* is named after the city Houston, Texas where Kathleen Armstrong Thomerson, lyricist and composer, attended church with her family at the Church of the Redeemer. A scriptural meditation and prayer with rich biblically based images of light, the hymn stands as a statement of its creator's personal faith. In the summer of 1996 her mother was visiting her in St. Louis when a heat wave hit. To escape the heat she decided to drive her mother back home to Houston. The anticipation of returning home to her family and church was a source of great joy and gave her the inspiration to write the hymn. Kathleen writes of the experience:

*"It was at that point that I started hearing the words and melody of this hymn. I remember walking around the house with paper and pencil in hand humming and writing while my mother said 'Kathleen, if we are leaving soon shouldn't you be packing?' We drove to Houston during which time I began to work out the harmonies in my head. I finished the harmonization in Houston on parents' piano."*

The hymn was introduced at the Church of the Redeemer in 1966 and has since been published in several hymn collections. It first appeared in an Episcopal collection in *Songs for Celebration* (New York, 1980). Please join us in singing this hymn during worship and at home with family around table to continue our work of connecting with our source of light, hope, and peace, Jesus Christ, and walking together on our journey.

I want to walk as a child of the light,  
I want to follow Jesus.  
God set the stars to give light to the world.  
The star of my life is Jesus.

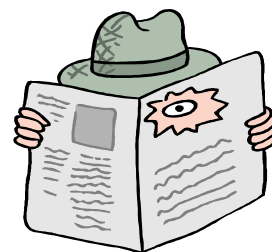

### **Rite-13**

On **Sunday, January 9<sup>th</sup>** at our 9:30 service, we will celebrate an important rite of passage with our 7<sup>th</sup> graders. They have been using a curriculum called **Rite-13**, named after the special liturgy we will celebrate with them on that day.

Here is a description of the Rite-13 liturgy from our *Journey to Adulthood* curriculum:

*In some respects, our Rite-13 liturgy is a new way of saying to our young people things we have meant to say all along – things like: “We stand with you as you make your way on the journey; we’re here if you need us; we think you are terrific; we love you.” We often assume that our teens feel appreciated and accepted as a vital part of our parish, but adolescence can be such a time of uncertainty that some things just can’t be said often enough.*

*One of the unique aspects of the Journey to Adulthood program is that it seeks to provide rites of passage that are often lacking in our culture. We help define points along the path to adulthood that tell our young people they are making progress; they are growing; they are becoming adults. Rite-13 is the liturgical cornerstone that lays the foundation for the entire congregation of St. Paul's to rise up and in one mighty voice and tell our young people, “You matter to us. Your lives are of inestimable value. The journey you are now embarking on is significant.” It is a way that we fulfill our baptismal covenant of “seeking and serving Christ in all persons.”*

*The Rite-13 Liturgy is a rite of passage that recognizes the gift that God gives each one of us: the gift of manhood or womanhood. This is a free gift that we cannot earn and need not prove.*

This is a great opportunity for us to affirm the young people who live and grow around us and to recognize them as emerging adults in our midst. Please join me in making sure they hear us loud and clear on January 9<sup>th</sup>.

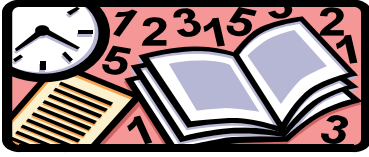
