As Mary and Joseph approach Bethlehem, we all join them. Across time and space, our hearts go where they go, our voices join the story in love, in support, in gratitude, and in hope that perhaps we too are called to carry God. All are invited to lend your voice to the "Congregation" lines.

Congregational Scene on the road to Bethlehem

John the Baptist: And so, we find ourselves on the road to Bethlehem. It's a long journey, they've been traveling for over a week and a half through hostile territory where they had to avoid wild boar and lions and highway robbers, on a donkey. It's been cold and rainy and, of course, she's pregnant.

Joseph: Maybe we should find a place to rest.

Mary: I'm worn through to my bones but I think we should push on.

Congregation: I bring you the strength of our foremothers

M: We can make it. But Joseph, I wonder if I'll be able to do this.

J: Mary, God has chosen you, among all the women in Israel.

Congregation: Mary, you are chosen. Thank you for saying yes!

M: God chose you also, sees who you are. And I see you too.

J: I can see it in your eyes.

Congregation: Joseph you are chosen. Thank you for saying yes!

M: I don't know why God chose us. Sometimes I think I'm asking too much of you.

J: Mary, it is not you who asks.

M: Do you ever wonder how this is all going to work? Where will we live, how will we support him? Protect him? Teach him?

J: I know! Teaching the son of God!?

Congregation: Mary. Joseph. Remember you are beloved. [Catherine stands]

M: In you and in God I find strength. I know we are doing what is right. But I wonder how other people will see it.

Congregation: Don't worry about criticism from others. Your path is holy. [Rob stands]

J: It's such a scary time to raise a child.

M: It is. I'm scared too.

Congregation: Mary and Joseph, we will hold all your fears. [Mike stands]

M: The joy is more than I can contain. And yet my heart is breaking. And I don't know why.

Congregation: Mary there is room in my broken heart for all that breaks yours. [Alisa stands]

J: My heart is breaking too. Breaking and bursting.

Congregation: Mary and Joseph your hearts may break but your souls are strong. [Val stands]

M: Together with you – and with God's help, we can do this.

J: Together with God.

The Holy Eucharist

Celebrant: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Author Almighty, writer of the heavens and creator of earth. Because you sent the Christ light to be born among the oppressed, to be parented by teenagers, to be protected by Shepherds, to be worshipped by Magi, to be a refugee in Africa, to be a Jew under Roman occupation in the Middle East, to be an adolescent teacher in a Synagogue, to be a carpenter, a Rabbi, a rabble-rouser, a God in flesh, walking by our side, teaching us to love in transformative ways.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Celebrant: We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN!**

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say, Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen. The Breaking of the Bread

Celebrant: Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us. Therefore let us keep the feast, Alleluia! People:

The gifts of God for the people of God, take them in remembrance that Christ has died for you and feed on him with faith in thanksgiving.

All are invited to come forward to receive Communion when the ushers guide you from your pe. All are welcome to receive the bread (tell the priest if you need GF), and one person will receive the wine on behalf of us all. The chalice bearer will still hold the chalice in front of you and say "The blood of Christ, the cup of salvation" we just ask you to not reach for it at this time. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, simply cross your arms when the priest gets to you.
